Rulemaking

The Washington Medical Commission (commission) has officially filed a <u>CR-101</u> with the Office of the Code Reviser on August 6, 2020. The WSR# is 20-17-024.

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The commission is considering adopting a new section of rule and amending WAC 246-919-340 to meet the requirements of <u>Senate Bill (SB) 6551</u> an act relating to integrating international medical graduates (IMG) into Washington's health care delivery system. The commission will consider creating an exceptional qualification waiver for international medical graduates pursuing a full medical license as well as creating a time-limited clinical experience license for those international medical graduates pursuing a full medical medical medical graduates participating in a tuition based clinical experience program.

SB 6551 permits the commission to issue limited licenses to IMG. The bill also directs the commission to establish requirements for an exceptional qualification waiver in rule as well as establish requirements for a time-limited clinical experience license for IMG applicants. Establishing these requirements would reduce barriers for IMG applicants obtaining residency positions in Washington.

The Washington Medical Commission (commission) is considering adopting a new section of rule and amending WAC 246-919-340 to meet the requirements of Senate Bill (SB) 6551 - An act relating to integrating international medical graduates (IMG) into Washington's health care delivery system. The commission will consider creating an exceptional qualification waiver for international medical graduates pursuing a full medical license as well as creating a time-limited clinical experience license for those international medical graduates participating in a tuition based clinical experience program.

Statutes authorizing the agency to adopt rules on this subject: RCW 18.71.017, RCW 18.130.050, and SB 6551 (chapter 325, Laws of 2020)

Reasons why rules on this subject may be needed and what they might accomplish: SB 6551 permits the commission to issue limited licenses to IMG. The bill also directs the commission to establish requirements for an exceptional qualification waiver in rule as well as establish requirements for a time-limited clinical experience license for IMG applicants. Establishing these requirements would reduce barriers for IMG applicants obtaining residency positions in Washington.

AN ACT Relating to integrating international medical graduates into Washington's health care delivery system; amending RCW 18.71.051 and 18.71.095; adding new sections to chapter 18.71 RCW; and providing an expiration date.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 18.71 7 RCW to read as follows:

8 (1) The international medical graduate implementation work group 9 is established. The work group membership must consist of the 10 following members appointed by the governor:

(a) A representative from the commission;

12 (b) A representative from the department of health, health13 systems quality assurance division;

14 (c) A representative from the University of Washington school of15 medicine graduate medical education program;

16 (d) A representative from the Washington State University Elson17 S. Floyd college of medicine graduate medical education program;

(e) A representative from the Pacific Northwest University of
 Health Sciences college of osteopathic medicine graduate medical
 education program;

1 (f) A representative from a statewide association representing 2 physicians;

3 (g) A representative from the Washington state family medicine 4 residency network;

5 (h) A representative from a primary care health care employer in 6 a rural or underserved area of Washington;

7 (i) A representative from a health carrier offering coverage in a8 rural or underserved area of Washington;

9 (j) A licensed physician with experience working with 10 international medical graduates;

11 (k) A representative from an organization specializing in refugee 12 advocacy in Washington;

13 (1) A representative from an organization serving refugee 14 physicians and international medical graduates;

(m) A representative from an organization offering counseling and
 educational programs to internationally trained health professionals;

(n) A representative from an organization representing communityand migrant health centers; and

(o) At least two international medical graduates.

20 (2) Staff support for the work group must be provided by the 21 department of health.

22 (3) The work group shall:

(a) Propose clinical readiness criteria for international medical
 graduates using published benchmarks for medical school graduation or
 residency admission;

(b) Propose a grant award process for distributing funds for approved entities to provide career guidance and clinical training to international medical graduates;

(c) Propose an evaluation process to grant a hardship waiver to international medical graduates who cannot provide all necessary documentation for licensure due to circumstances outside their control; and

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(d) Provide policy recommendations to the legislature.

34 (4) The work group must submit an annual report to the 35 legislature by June 30, 2021, and yearly thereafter.

36 (5) This section expires July 1, 2025.

37 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 18.71 38 RCW to read as follows:

Based on recommendations from the international medical graduate implementation work group, the commission shall adopt a clinical assessment to determine the readiness of international medical graduates to apply and serve in residency programs and adopt a grant award process for distributing funds pursuant to section 3 of this act.

7 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 18.71 8 RCW to read as follows:

9 Subject to appropriation by the legislature and donations 10 received from public and private entities, the department of health 11 shall award grant funding to:

(1) Approved entities for career guidance and support services to international medical graduates including, but not limited to, assistance with educational commission for foreign medical graduates certification application and United States medical licensing examination preparation; and

17 (2) Health care facilities or clinical programs to provide18 supervised clinical training to international medical graduates.

19 Sec. 4. RCW 18.71.051 and 2011 c 138 s 1 are each amended to 20 read as follows:

21 (1) Applicants for licensure to practice medicine who have 22 graduated from a school of medicine located outside of the states, 23 territories, and possessions of the United States, the District of 24 Columbia, or the Dominion of Canada, shall file an application for 25 licensure with the commission on a form prepared by the secretary 26 with the approval of the commission. Each applicant shall furnish 27 proof satisfactory to the commission of the following:

28 (((1))) <u>(a)</u> That he or she has completed in a school of medicine 29 a resident course of professional instruction equivalent to that 30 required in this chapter for applicants generally;

31 (((2)(a))) <u>(b)(i)</u> Except as provided in (b)<u>(ii)</u> of this 32 subsection, that he or she meets all the requirements which must be 33 met by graduates of the United States and Canadian school of medicine 34 except that he or she need not have graduated from a school of 35 medicine approved by the commission;

36 (((b))) <u>(ii)</u> An applicant for licensure under this section is not 37 required to meet the requirements of RCW 18.71.050(1)(b) if he or she 38 furnishes proof satisfactory to the commission that he or she has:

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1 (((i)(A))) (A)(I) Been admitted as a permanent immigrant to the 2 United States as a person of exceptional ability in sciences pursuant 3 to the rules of the United States department of labor; or

(((B))) <u>(II)</u> Been issued a permanent immigration visa; and

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5 (((ii))) <u>(B)</u> Received multiple sclerosis certified specialist 6 status from the consortium of multiple sclerosis centers; and

7 ((((iii))) (C) Successfully completed at least twenty-four months 8 of training in multiple sclerosis at an educational institution in 9 the United States with an accredited residency program in neurology 10 or rehabilitation;

11 (((3))) <u>(c)</u> That he or she has satisfactorily passed the 12 examination given by the educational council for foreign medical 13 graduates or has met the requirements in lieu thereof as set forth in 14 rules adopted by the commission;

15 (((4))) <u>(d)</u> That he or she has the ability to read, write, speak, 16 understand, and be understood in the English language.

17 (2) An applicant may obtain an exceptional qualification waiver, 18 waiving requirements determined by the commission in rule, if they 19 possess an acceptable body of work related to research, medical 20 excellence, or employment, and have the recommendation of other 21 national or international experts in the same specialty or field.

22 Sec. 5. RCW 18.71.095 and 2017 c 45 s 1 are each amended to read 23 as follows:

The commission may, without examination, issue a limited license to persons who possess the qualifications set forth herein:

(1) The commission may, upon the written request of the secretary 26 27 of the department of social and health services or the secretary of 28 corrections, issue a limited license to practice medicine in this state to persons who have been accepted for employment by the 29 30 department of social and health services or the department of 31 corrections as physicians; who are licensed to practice medicine in another state of the United States or in the country of Canada or any 32 province or territory thereof; and who meet all of the qualifications 33 for licensure set forth in RCW 18.71.050. 34

35 Such license shall permit the holder thereof to practice medicine 36 only in connection with patients, residents, or inmates of the state 37 institutions under the control and supervision of the secretary of 38 the department of social and health services or the department of 39 corrections.

1 (2) The commission may issue a limited license to practice 2 medicine in this state to persons who have been accepted for 3 employment by a county or city health department as physicians; who 4 are licensed to practice medicine in another state of the United 5 States or in the country of Canada or any province or territory 6 thereof; and who meet all of the qualifications for licensure set 7 forth in RCW 18.71.050.

8 Such license shall permit the holder thereof to practice medicine 9 only in connection with his or her duties in employment with the city 10 or county health department.

(3) Upon receipt of a completed application showing that the 11 applicant meets all of the requirements for licensure set forth in 12 RCW 18.71.050 except for completion of two years of postgraduate 13 medical training, and that the applicant has been appointed as a 14 resident physician in a program of postgraduate clinical training in 15 16 this state approved by the commission, the commission may issue a 17 limited license to a resident physician. Such license shall permit the resident physician to practice medicine only in connection with 18 19 his or her duties as a resident physician and shall not authorize the physician to engage in any other form of practice. Each resident 20 21 physician shall practice medicine only under the supervision and control of a physician licensed in this state, but such supervision 22 23 and control shall not be construed to necessarily require the personal presence of the supervising physician at the place where 24 25 services are rendered.

(4) (a) Upon nomination by the dean of an accredited school of 26 27 medicine in the state of Washington or the chief executive officer of 28 a hospital or other appropriate health care facility licensed in the state of Washington, the commission may issue a limited license to a 29 physician applicant invited to serve as a teaching-research member of 30 31 the institution's instructional staff if the sponsoring institution 32 and the applicant give evidence that he or she has graduated from a recognized medical school and has been licensed or otherwise 33 privileged to practice medicine at his or her location of origin. 34 Such license shall permit the recipient to practice medicine only 35 within the confines of the instructional program specified in the 36 application and shall terminate whenever the holder ceases to be 37 involved in that program, or at the end of one year, whichever is 38 39 earlier. Upon request of the applicant and the institutional 40 authority, the license may be renewed. The holder of a teaching

(b) Upon nomination by the dean of an accredited school of 19 medicine in the state of Washington or the chief executive officer of 20 21 any hospital or appropriate health care facility licensed in the 22 state of Washington, the commission may issue a limited license to an applicant selected by the sponsoring institution to be enrolled in 23 one of its designated departmental or divisional fellowship programs 24 25 provided that the applicant shall have graduated from a recognized medical school and has been granted a license or other appropriate 26 certificate to practice medicine in the location of the applicant's 27 origin. Such license shall permit the holder only to practice 28 medicine within the confines of the fellowship program to which he or 29 she has been appointed and, upon the request of the applicant and the 30 31 sponsoring institution, the license may be renewed by the commission.

All persons licensed under this section shall be subject to the jurisdiction of the commission to the same extent as other members of the medical profession, in accordance with this chapter and chapter 18.130 RCW.

Persons applying for licensure and renewing licenses pursuant to this section shall comply with administrative procedures, administrative requirements, and fees determined as provided in RCW 43.70.250 and 43.70.280. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 Sec. 1. RCW 18.71.095 and 2020 c 325 s 5 are each amended to 5 read as follows:

6 The commission may, without examination, issue a limited license 7 to persons who possess the qualifications set forth herein:

8 (1) The commission may, upon the written request of the secretary 9 of the department of social and health services, the secretary of children, youth, and families, or the secretary of corrections, issue 10 11 a limited license to practice medicine in this state to persons who 12 have been accepted for employment by the department of social and health services, the department of children, youth, and families, or 13 14 the department of corrections as physicians; who are licensed to practice medicine in another state of the United States or in the 15 16 country of Canada or any province or territory thereof; and who meet 17 all of the qualifications for licensure set forth in RCW 18.71.050.

Such license shall permit the holder thereof to practice medicine only in connection with patients, residents, or inmates of the state institutions under the control and supervision of the secretary of 1 the department of social and health services, the department of 2 <u>children</u>, youth, and families, or the department of corrections.

3 (2) The commission may issue a limited license to practice 4 medicine in this state to persons who have been accepted for 5 employment by a county or city health department as physicians; who 6 are licensed to practice medicine in another state of the United 7 States or in the country of Canada or any province or territory 8 thereof; and who meet all of the qualifications for licensure set 9 forth in RCW 18.71.050.

10 Such license shall permit the holder thereof to practice medicine 11 only in connection with his or her duties in employment with the city 12 or county health department.

(3) Upon receipt of a completed application showing that the 13 applicant meets all of the requirements for licensure set forth in 14 15 RCW 18.71.050 except for completion of two years of postgraduate 16 medical training, and that the applicant has been appointed as a 17 resident physician in a program of postgraduate clinical training in 18 this state approved by the commission, the commission may issue a 19 limited license to a resident physician. Such license shall permit the resident physician to practice medicine only in connection with 20 21 his or her duties as a resident physician and shall not authorize the 22 physician to engage in any other form of practice. Each resident physician shall practice medicine only under the supervision and 23 control of a physician licensed in this state, but such supervision 24 25 and control shall not be construed to necessarily require the personal presence of the supervising physician at the place where 26 27 services are rendered.

28 (4) (a) Upon nomination by the dean of an accredited school of medicine in the state of Washington or the chief executive officer of 29 a hospital or other appropriate health care facility licensed in the 30 31 state of Washington, the commission may issue a limited license to a 32 physician applicant invited to serve as a teaching-research member of 33 the institution's instructional staff if the sponsoring institution and the applicant give evidence that he or she has graduated from a 34 recognized medical school and has been licensed or otherwise 35 privileged to practice medicine at his or her location of origin. 36 Such license shall permit the recipient to practice medicine only 37 within the confines of the instructional program specified in the 38 39 application and shall terminate whenever the holder ceases to be 40 involved in that program, or at the end of one year, whichever is

earlier. Upon request of the applicant and the institutional authority, the license may be renewed. The holder of a teaching research license under this subsection (4)(a) is eligible for full licensure if the following conditions are met:

5 (i) If the applicant has not graduated from a school of medicine 6 located in any state, territory, or possession of the United States, 7 the District of Columbia, or the Dominion of Canada, the applicant 8 must satisfactorily pass the certification process by the educational 9 commission for foreign medical graduates;

10 (ii) The applicant has successfully completed the exam 11 requirements set forth by the commission by rule;

12 (iii) The applicant has the ability to read, write, speak, 13 understand, and be understood in the English language at a level 14 acceptable for performing competent medical care in all practice 15 settings;

16 (iv) The applicant has continuously held a position of associate 17 professor or higher at an accredited Washington state medical school 18 for no less than three years; and

19 (v) The applicant has had no disciplinary action taken in the 20 previous five years.

(b) Upon nomination by the dean of an accredited school of 21 medicine in the state of Washington or the chief executive officer of 22 any hospital or appropriate health care facility licensed in the 23 state of Washington, the commission may issue a limited license to an 24 25 applicant selected by the sponsoring institution to be enrolled in one of its designated departmental or divisional fellowship programs 26 provided that the applicant shall have graduated from a recognized 27 28 medical school and has been granted a license or other appropriate certificate to practice medicine in the location of the applicant's 29 origin. Such license shall permit the holder only to practice 30 31 medicine within the confines of the fellowship program to which he or 32 she has been appointed and, upon the request of the applicant and the sponsoring institution, the license may be renewed by the commission. 33

All persons licensed under this section shall be subject to the jurisdiction of the commission to the same extent as other members of the medical profession, in accordance with this chapter and chapter 18.130 RCW.

Persons applying for licensure and renewing licenses pursuant to this section shall comply with administrative procedures, administrative requirements, and fees determined as provided in RCW 43.70.250 and 43.70.280. Any person who obtains a limited license pursuant to this section may apply for licensure under this chapter, but shall submit a new application form and comply with all other licensing requirements of this chapter.

5 (5) The commission may issue a time-limited clinical experience 6 license to an applicant who does not qualify for licensure under RCW 7 18.71.050 or chapter 18.71B RCW and who meets the requirements 8 established by the commission in rule for the purpose of gaining 9 clinical experience at an approved facility or program.

10 (6) (a) Upon nomination by the chief medical officer of any 11 hospital or appropriate health care facility licensed in the state of 12 Washington, the department of social and health services, the 13 department of children, youth, and families, the department of 14 corrections, or a county or city health department, the commission 15 may issue a limited license to an international medical graduate if 16 the applicant:

(i) Has been a Washington state resident for at least one year;

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18 (ii) Provides proof the applicant is certified by the educational 19 commission for foreign medical graduates;

20 <u>(iii) Has passed all steps of the United States medical licensing</u>
21 <u>examination; and</u>

22 (iv) Submits to the commission background check process required 23 of applicants generally.

(b) A license holder under this subsection may only practice:

25 (i) Under the supervision and control of a physician who is 26 licensed in this state under chapter 18.71 RCW and is of the same or 27 substantially similar clinical specialty; and

(ii) Within the nominating facility or organization.

(c) A license holder must file with the commission a practice
 agreement between the license holder and the supervising physician
 who is of the same or substantially similar clinical specialty.

32 <u>(d) A supervising physician may supervise no more than two</u> 33 <u>license holders under this subsection unless the commission grants a</u> 34 <u>request to increase this limit.</u>

35 (e) A limited license issued under this subsection is valid for 36 two years and may be renewed once by the commission upon application 37 for renewal by the nominating entity.
