

- Independent, full authority, regulator of allopathic physicians and physician assistants.
- Operates as a hybrid/remote organization.
- Collaborates with the DOH under a joint operating agreement.
- WMC published their <u>2023-2025 Strategic Plan</u>.

ACTIONS IN FISCAL YEAR (FY) 2023

- Issued 4,297 new licenses.
- Received 1,644 complaints/reports.
- Completed legal process on 628 investigations.

SIGNIFICANT ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Instituted a Practitioner Support Program to provide helpful resources to physicians and physician assistants.
- Instituted a program to help complainants provide information needed to review their complaints.
- The WMC was recognized as a *WellBeing First Champion* for 2023 and is among twenty-one other U.S. states who have made these changes to protect practitioner health. In order to receive this award, *ALL IN: WellBeing First for Healthcare*, a coaltion of leading health care organizations, has verified the WMC Licensure applications are free from intrusive and stigmatizing language around mental health care and treatment. The WMC offers a "safe haven" provision in our application.
