



# Rescission of Proclamation 20-32: Waivers ending, and CME requirements being reinstated

# Background

- CME Requirements were suspended (March 2020) during the pandemic by Governor Proclamation
  - These emergency orders will expire on October 27<sup>th</sup>
- Effective on October 27, 2022, the following pre-COVID requirements will all return:
  - Physician Assistants physician supervision ratios, and practice agreement requirements;
  - Limited License holders will have restrictions regarding geographic locations or specific jobs as described in their appointments;
  - Retired Active MD licensees will have restrictions that include not receiving compensation for health care services and only practicing in emergent or intermittent circumstances; and
  - Retired Active PA licensees will have requirements to have a delegation agreement and will be prohibited from receiving compensation for health care services.









# **Practice Agreements Requirements**

- Practice agreements must be filed with the WMC.
  - The WMC no longer 'approves' practice agreements you only need to file the practice agreements with us.
  - Practice agreements can be created and modified with the <u>WMC online portal</u>.
- Supervising Physicians can supervise up-to 10 PAs unless otherwise approved by the WMC.
- Remote site supervision waivers are no longer required.









### **CME Attestation Due Dates for MDs**

CME Due Date	New Due Date Under Waiver
October 28 – December 31, 2022	Your Birthday in 2026
January 1 – October 27, 2023	Your Birthday in 2027









# For Example....

- My CME attestation is due on November 13<sup>th</sup>, 2022:
- Your attestation is now due on November 13<sup>th</sup>, 2026.

- My CME attestation is due on June 26<sup>th</sup> 2023:
- Your attestation is now due on June 26<sup>th</sup> 2027.

- My CME attestation is due on November 1st 2023:
- Your attestation is due on November 1<sup>st</sup> 2023.









### **CME Attestation Due Dates for PAs**

CME Due Date	New Due Date Under Waiver
October 28 – December 31, 2022	Your Birthday in 2024
January 1 – October 27, 2023	Your Birthday in 2025







# For Example....

- My CME attestation is due on December 1<sup>st</sup> 2022:
- Your attestation is now due on December 1<sup>st</sup> 2024.

- My CME attestation is due on June 26<sup>th</sup> 2023:
- Your attestation is now due on June 26<sup>th</sup> 2025.
- My CME attestation is due on October 29<sup>th</sup> 2023:
- Your attestation is due on October 29<sup>th</sup> 2023.









# **Waiver Process**

- If you are unable to complete your CME requirements by the extension date you can receive a one-time extension by sending an email to <a href="mailto:medical.licensing@wmc.wa.gov">medical.licensing@wmc.wa.gov</a>.
- Attach a word document or PDF with the following:
  - Your name, license number and contact information
  - Where you are currently employed
  - Brief explanation of the circumstances that are preventing you from completing the CME requirement
- Requests must be received at least 30 days prior to the due date.









### **FAQ**

- CME that was completed during the proclamation time frame is still valid toward your CME requirements.
  - You do not need to complete a new set of CME hours toward your required amount once the proclamation expires.
- You do not need to provide physical documentation of your acquired CMEs during your renewal.
  - If the WMC needs additional CME information we will contact you.
- If you are manually renewing your license please note on your renewal notice if you are taking advantage of the CME extension or waiver.
- An online renewal is automatically eligible for extension.
